SPP Montebello Summit - August 20-21, 2007

Prime Minister Stephen Harper will meet with US President George W. Bush and Mexican President Felipe Calderon at Montebello on August 20-21, 2007 to discuss the Security and Prosperity Partnership (SPP).

Unions and other social action organizations, along with local activists are working together to send a strong message of opposition to the big-business vision of North American integration contained in the SPP - a vision that has yet to be widely debated anywhere but which will have major impacts on citizens across the continent.

What is SPP?

SPP is an agreement between the US, Mexico and Canada. One of its main objectives is to align the Canadian security policy to the American one. Also, that agreement aims at combining both security and economic integration of all three countries as well as increasing the competitiveness by deregulating and liberalizing these national economies.

Why you should care?

Deep integration poses new risks for Canada's energy, security, water, public health care and other public services and the environment.

This will lead to increased privatization and will have a huge negative impact on the working conditions of workers. All this without any debate at the Parliament
